Amendment of  
Section 213.

3. Section 213 of the principal Law is hereby amended in the following respects:-

- (a) by inserting in subsection (1) next after the words "lodging the appeal" the words "taking or";
- (b) by deleting from subsection (1) the words "for the due prosecution of such appeal, and";
- (c) by deleting from subsection (4) the word "ten" and substituting therefor the word "twenty-one";
- (d) by inserting in subsection (4) next after the words "his right of appeal shall" the words "subject to the provisions of subsection (4) of section 211".

Addition of new  
Section 213A.

4. The principal Law is hereby amended by inserting next after section 213 the following as section 213A:-

"Grounds of  
Appeal

213A (1) - The grounds of appeal shall set out concisely the facts and points of law (if any) on which the appellant intends to rely in support of his appeal and shall conclude with a statement of the relief prayed for by the appellant.

(2) - The Court of Appeal may dismiss without hearing, any appeal in which the grounds of appeal do not comply with the provisions of subsection (1)."

The Dental (Amendment) Law, 1967

Enacted by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

( )

1. This Law may be cited as the Dental (Amendment) Law, 1967 and shall be read and construed as one with the Dental Law (hereinafter referred to as the principal Law) and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.

Short title

Cap. 36

2. Paragraph (b) of section 3 is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the following word:-

Amendment of  
section 3(b).

"and to demand and recover reasonable charges for dental aid rendered by such person and the cost of dental medicines and appliances supplied by him."

Regulations. 3. The principal law is hereby amended by adding the following section thereto as section 10 -

“10..The Administrator in Council may make regulations generally for the better carrying out of the provisions of this law, and in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such regulations may -

(a) provide for the management and discipline of any dental clinic; and

(b) prescribe the fees to be payable in respect of any treatment, accommodation, amenities, facilities, services or materials of any description provided by or through the Government, and provide for the manner in which such fees shall be collected, accounted for and disposed of.”

A Law to amend the Justices of the Peace Jurisdiction Law. Long title.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Justices of the Peace Jurisdiction (Amendment) Law, 1967 and shall be read and construed as one with the Justices of the Peace Jurisdiction Law (hereinafter referred to as the principal Law). Short title

2. Section 11 of the principal Law is hereby amended in the following respect:- Amendment of section 11.

- (a) by renumbering the section as section 11 (1); and
- (b) by adding thereto the following subsection as subsection (2):-

“(2) The offences specified in paragraphs (4)
