A LAW to Amend the Pensions Law.

(C ap. 121)

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Pensions (Amendment) Law, 1967, and shall be read and construed as one with the Pensions Law (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law) and shall come into operation on a date to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.

2. Section 2 of the principal Law is hereby amended in the following respects:-

- (a) by inserting in paragraph (a) of the definition of "pensionable emoluments" immediately after the words "personal allowance" the words "inducement allowance"; and

(b) by inserting immediately following the definition of "house allowance" the following definition:-

"inducement allowance" means the inducement allowance referred to in paragraph (a) of clause 3 of the Overseas Service Cayman Islands Agreement 1961;".
