

“(4) Any person who uses or attempts to use a road or portion of road specified in the declaration under subsection (1) after thirty days from the date specified therein shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction before the Magistrate or two Justices to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.”

The Public Service Commission Law, 1967

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

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1. This Law may be cited as the Public Service Commission Law, 1967, and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.

Short title

2. In this Law -

(a) “public office” means any office of emolument in the public service;

(b) “public officer” means the holder of any public office and includes any person appointed to act in any such office; and

(c) the “public service” means the service of the Crown in respect of the government of the Islands.

3. In exercise of all functions conferred on him by this Law the Administrator shall not be obliged to consult with the Executive Council of the Islands.

Public

4. The appointment, promotion, transfer, dismissal or disciplinary control of public officers is hereby vested in the Administrator.

Creation

5. (1) There shall be in and for the Islands, a Public Service Commission (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission") and, subject to the provisions of subsection (3) of this section, the Commission shall consist of such persons, appointed in such manner, as may be prescribed by regulations made under this Law.

(2) The Administrator may terminate the appointment of any member of the Commission and, subject as aforesaid, the members of the Commission shall hold office upon such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by regulations made under this Law.

(3) No person shall be appointed as, or shall remain, a member of the Commission if he is a Member of the Legislative Assembly of the Islands.

6. The Administrator shall, save and except the matters specified in subsections (2) and (3) and (4) of section 9, and section 53 in so far as that section relates to the power to constitute offices for the Islands, of the Cayman Islands (Constitution) Order 1965 and all amendments thereto, refer to the Commission for their advice any question relating to the appointment (including promotion and transfer) or to the dismissal or other disciplinary control of public officers or any public officer, or to any other matter which, in his opinion, affects the public service:

Provided that no judge, magistrate or Attorney General shall be regarded, for the purposes of this section, as a public officer.

(2) It shall be the duty of the Commission to advise the Administrator of any question which he shall refer to it in accordance with the provisions of this section.

Power
to make
regulations

7. The Administrator in Council may make regulations for giving effect to the provisions of this Law, and in particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power may by such regulations made provision for all or any of the following matters, that is to say -

- (a) the membership of the Commission;
- (b) the appointment, tenure of office and terms of service of members of the Commission;
- (c) the organisation of the work of the Commission and the manner in which the Commission shall perform its functions;
- (d) consultation by the Commission with persons other than members of the Commission;
- (e) the appointment, tenure of office and terms of service of staff to assist the Commission in the performance of its functions;
- (f) the delegation to any member of the Commission of all or any of the powers or duties of the Commission;
- (g) the protection and privilege of members of the Commission in respect of the performance of their duties and the privilege of communication to and from the Commission or its members in case of legal proceedings.
