**THE POSTAL LAW (LAW 25 OF 1977)
POSTAL (AMENDMENT) (NO.2) REGULATIONS, 1983**

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by section 24 of the Postal Law, the following Regulations are hereby made –

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Postal (Amendment) (No.2) Regulations, 1983.

Insertion of new
Regulation 34A.

2. The Postal Regulations are amended by inserting the following new regulation immediately after regulation 34 –

“Unaddressed mail.

- 34A. (1) The Postmaster General may, at his discretion, accept as inland post to be sorted into every private bag in any branch or office unaddressed mail identifying the sender which is not stamped or otherwise prepaid, on the following conditions –
- (a) before it is accepted for posting, a specimen will be required and on acceptance cash equivalent to the appropriate postage must be paid;
 - (b) every item of the unaddressed mail measures, or has been folded by the sender to measure, not more than twelve inches by four and one-half inches and is identical in every respect.
- (2) Ordinary mail shall take priority over unaddressed mail although the Post Office will endeavour to sort unaddressed mail as soon as practicable.
- (3) Unaddressed mail posted under this regulation cannot be accepted for posting during the month of December in any year.”.
