“12. The fourth Monday in January, to be known as National Heroes Day.”.

4. (1) Section 3 (a) shall cease to have effect upon the third Tuesday in May 2003. Expiry

(2) Upon the expiration of section 3(a) the Law in force immediately prior to the coming into operation of section 3 (a) shall, so far as it is amended by section 3 (a) again operate as though this Law had not been passed and the said amendment had not been enacted.

Short title

1. This Law may be cited as the Public Holidays (Amendment) Law, 2002.

Amendment of the Public Holidays Law (1995 Revision)- public general holidays

2. The Public Holidays Law (1995 Revision) is amended by repealing section 2 and substituting the following-

“2. (1) The days listed in the Schedule are hereby declared to be Public General Holidays.

(2) The Governor may amend the Schedule by order.”.

Amendment of the Schedule to the Public Holidays Law (1995 Revision)

3. The Public Holidays Law (1995 Revision) is amended in the Schedule as follows-

(a) by repealing paragraph 5 and substituting the following-

“5. The third Monday in May, to be known as Seafarer’s Day in recognition of the contribution made by seamen towards the development of the Cayman Islands.”; and
