**A LAW TO ALLOW AND CONFIRM
CERTAIN EXPENDITURE
DURING THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1988**

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

Short Title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (1988) Law, 1990.

Expenditure confirmed.

2. The expenditure during the financial year ended 31st December, 1988, in the amount of Seven Million, Twenty-Three Thousand, Three Hundred and Forty-Two Dollars and Seventy-Nine Cents (\$7,023,342.79) on services set forth in the Schedule and not provided for by the Appropriation (1988) Law, 1987, is hereby allowed and confirmed.
