#### A LAW TO ALLOW AND CONFIRM CERTAIN EXPENDITURE **DURING THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1993**

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (1993) Law, Short title 2002.
