THE TRAFFIC LAW (REVISED)

THE TRAFFIC (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) REGULATIONS, 1991

In exercise of the power conferred on the Governor by section 77(b) of the Traffic Law (Revised), the following Regulations are made –

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Traffic (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1991.

Amendment to Reg. 25
of the Traffic Regs.

2. Regulation 25 of the Traffic Regulations is amended by deleting paragraph (3) and substituting the following as paragraphs (3) and (3A)
–

"(3) Subject to the exceptions specified in the proviso to this paragraph anything affixed to, or built into, the windscreen or any window of a motor vehicle whereby the degree of light transmission in either direction is diminished below that which is specified in paragraph (b) is declared to be unsafe, and, for the purpose of paragraph (1)(a), is hereby expressly disapproved:

PROVIDED THAT –

- (a) the front windscreen of a vehicle, which shall be of clear glass, may have, at the top thereof, a strip of tinted glass of any degree of light transmission not exceeding four inches in width measured from the top of the windscreen;
- (b) all windows shall, if tinted, allow a minimum of thirty-five *per centum* of light transmission when measured by the measuring device referred to in paragraph (3A) whether the glass is tinted by the manufacturer thereof or by any other person.
